## Defined Benefit Plan – Explained

Kansas City Public School Retirement System is a defined-benefit (DB) plan that began on January 1, 1944. A DB plan is pre-funded, both by the employer and employee, into a common pension trust. The pooled monies are managed by professional asset managers, reducing fees over the long term. Once the member has met the criteria for retirement, often years of service plus age, the member qualifies for a lifetime benefit.

A defined-contribution (DC) plan (401k, 403b, 457b, IRA) is an individual account often self-directed and self-funded. Participants choose how much they want to save, how they want to invest the contributed funds into the account and how they wish to withdraw their funds upon retirement. It does not guarantee a lifetime benefit.

One aspect of a defined benefit plan is your retirement benefit does not change in relation to market volatility. A DB plan, with its diversified portfolio, provides downside protection in years when the market is down, whereas, in a DC plan, your total amount of money varies with market volatility. This can have a negative impact on the amount of money withdrawn in retirement as there is no guarantee that your monthly benefit will remain the same.

Also, with a DC plan, individuals may outlive the funds available to them during retirement. The money you possess in your account is what you accumulate over time in your savings plans through contributions and investment earnings. The benefit is determined by how well an individual invests the account and the market conditions at and during retirement.

In addition, individuals have to decide how they want to spend their money upon retirement (what percentage each year) and they must estimate how long they might live to ensure they have enough money to survive. This can often lead individuals to impose upon themselves a lower standard of living.

With a DB plan, this is not a worry. You are guaranteed a set payment for the remainder of your life; in other words, your benefit cannot be outlived. This provides a level of retirement security as you need not worry about the market and its fluctuations, and you know how much money you will have each month.

In addition, DB plans often contain spousal protections, disability protections and COLAs when certain criteria are met. These supplemental benefits are not often found in DC plans.

## Portability

If a member switches jobs between the KC School District, the KC charter schools, and/or KC Public Libraries, the member's account continues uninterrupted wherever the member ends up working – contributions will continue to be reported by the member's new employer. No action is required by the member. If a member leaves employment in Kansas City, she or he may choose from several options regarding portability of the member's account balance, including:

- If a vested member leaves their account balance with the Retirement System, interest will continue to be earned each year until the member is eligible for a monthly benefit or dies. If you are not vested, your account will earn interest for up to four years after termination of employment.
- If a vested member, you have the following additional options:
  - Refund of contributions and interest—(1) Rollover the member account balance into another qualified tax deferred plan; (2) take a lump sum cash payout of the member account balance net any taxes (Note: If you are under 59 1/2, the IRS generally assesses an additional 10% penalty on withdrawals.)
  - Reciprocity Options—(1) Missouri Reciprocity for Recognition of Service RsMO 169.569 (Note: The individual must be vested in both KCPSRS and another Missouri education retirement system to be eligible to recognize service at no cost to the individual.); (2) Missouri Reciprocity Transfer, RsMO 105.691 (Note: Individual must be vested in both KCPSRS and another Missouri public retirement system with a cooperative agreement with KCPSRS. Currently the only such cooperative agreements are with PSRS and PEERS.)

## Important Update: Request for Refund Application Form Changes

### Date for Submission and Notarization:

Starting March 1st, the submission date for all Request for Refund Application Forms will change from the 15th of each month to the 1st of each month. Applications must be received by 2 p.m. on the 1st of the month.

In addition, all Request for Refund Application Forms will need to be signed in the presence of a notary.

### Why the Change?

Better Flow: Submitting at the start of the month helps us process everything faster and keeps reports accurate.

Less Stress: No more mid-month rush—everything gets handled in one clean cycle.

Consistency: Aligning with other monthly tasks makes life easier for everyone.

Security: Notary provides enhanced security of the contributions you have made to the System.
